Approval of Minutes:

***MOTION:** Paula made a motion to approve both November and December minutes as written. Farah seconded this motion and it was unanimously approved by all.*

Update on CLG grant:

The grant is due the second weekend of February. Don and Megan will continue to be in contact with Alena Franco with the State regarding this CLG grant through SHPO.

Old Foundry Monument:

Aleese Cardon – The Old Foundry Monument used to sit at the City park by the old cabin and when they went to relocate it, it crumbled. The ball from the top of the monument is with the parks department in the old sexton house, currently located in the fireplace. It would be nice to rebuild this monument. Maybe we should approach Sons of the Utah Pioneers to assist. Where is it going to go, who is going to do it and how much is it going to cost? Can we gift it to the State to display at the Iron Mission exhibit and assist them in creating the story behind it? Can we help fund the interpretation and the display? Ask the City if we can get their permission to relocate it. Check with Frontier Homestead to see if they will take it and then we can go about interpreting it.

When things are decommissioned can we have an agreement made so that this stuff does not happen again? The Fort Cedar monument is in the process of being relocated, can we place it near the new walking trails rather than the roundabout?

Historic Markers in Cedar City –

Fluffy Bundle – it was on 100 W next to a singer sewing machine store. It was the birthplace of the Shakespeare Festival. Maybe a piece of art or a sign, some sort of Historical Marker. It would be nice if we created a historical Marker that we could create to keep the same look and theme throughout all of the Markers placed within the City. The whole Shakespeare has a history of an idea that a community supported the man with the idea.

***Motion:** Paula Mitchell made a motion to approve placing a Fluffy Bundle historic marker. Aleese Cardon seconded the motion. This was unanimously approved by all.*

Cedar House Hotel (Jolley's Ranchwear) – the birthplace of bringing tourism into Cedar City.

The TDS building is also a historical marker, could we make it a better one? Bigger and better. Brigham Young, this is the place where we will make Downtown Cedar City.

We will come back next month with the wording for 2 potential markers next month. Ryan will work on the wording for the Fluffy Bundle and the Brigham Young Downtown Cedar City markers.

TERM LIMITS:
