will take place this year from October 24th - 27th.


Chad Reid, the Chairman of the Cedar Livestock & Heritage Festival, stated the following: “We are extremely excited of how this festival has grown and expanded over the past 14 years. Of course we are humbled and thankful this festival has been so successful. We proudly continue to honor the rich and inspiring history of Iron County and Southern Utah. Agriculture started with the Fremont Indians sixteen hundred years ago and continues today, with our many diverse farms and ranches, agriculture is still “Very Important” in Iron County. This fall will be no different than the past 148 years, for it means the harvesting of crops and the trailing of livestock from the high mountain ranges to the desert for winter. The first sheep were herded up on Cedar Mountain in 1890, and every year since then, they have made the trek from the mountain to the valley, making their way through Cedar City. This year will be no exception. We are proud that our festival will once again celebrate this important and historic event.

The success of this festival has far exceeded our expectations; a large part of this success is that it must be the “right” festival at the “right” time in the “right” place. We have a great committee that has worked very hard to make this the “right” festival. One of the great things about our festival is that it’s virtually free to the public. Again this year, we will have a Thursday night Grand Marshall reception and a concert, featuring Dave Stamey one of the best “Western” performers in the West.

We are also excited to have added to our Stock Dog contest it will be two days this year (Thursday and Friday) with some of the best dog handlers and dogs in Utah. Of course we will be continuing for the third year our Lead Line contest on Saturday; this is a very unique fashion show where the contestants must lead a sheep down the runway wearing corresponding dress to the contestant (extra points if its wool). We also will be having a sheep shearing demonstration. In addition, we will also have Draft horse pulls, Antique tractor pulls, Vendors, Antique car show, Dutch oven cooking contest, Western poetry and music, Kids pedal tractor pull, Ranch rodeo and the “Greatest Parade” you have ever seen. You certainly will not want to miss this event! It is that time again for each of us to have our voices heard in the Cedar City Municipal Election. Please exercise your right to vote, as the decisions that are made here on a local level truly impact each of our daily lives.

This year the General Municipal Election is Tuesday, November 5th. If you haven't registered to vote yet, it is not too late. However, voters that have moved or changed their name must register or re-register to vote. Registering or re-registering for the general election can be done either online ([www.vote.utah.gov](http://www.vote.utah.gov)) or in person by October 29th.

Similar to the Primary Election, for the November 5th General Election you will be voting for the three (3) seats open on the Cedar City Council. The following six individuals made it through the primary election and are all vying for the three open seats: Don Oswald, W. Tyler Melling, Terri W. Hartley, Adam Hahn, Brittanie Parry, and Craig E. Isom.

Iron County is a by-mail county. All active voters will receive a ballot in the mail. Ballots are mailed to the address where you are registered about three (3) weeks prior to each election date. Be sure your mailing address is correct at: [www.vote.utah.gov](http://www.vote.utah.gov).

Returned ballots must have postage and be clearly postmarked by the day before the election. You may also drop off your ballot in the locked ballot box at the Cedar City Office (10 N Main, Cedar) or at the County Clerk's (68 South 100 East, Parowan).

You may drop off your ballot on election day into the provided locked ballot box or vote on the voting machines at the Cedar City Council Chambers (10 N Main, Cedar).



**AIRPORT:** With the reopening of the St. George Airport, our Cedar City SkyWest flight schedule will change. Please visit the City's website [www.cedarcity.org](http://www.cedarcity.org) and click on the link to the airport to check for the latest flight details. We would like to thank everyone for your patronage of the Airport.

**SOLID WASTE:** We would like to remind all residents living in cul-de-sacs to bring their garbage cans to the beginning of the cul-de-sac. We are required to keep backing maneuvers to a minimum to keep everyone safe and for insurance purposes. Putting your cans on the straight-a-way before the cul-de-sac allows for safer operation of the equipment. Please place cans at least 3-feet from vehicles and other cans. Also, please remember to have your can out by 7:00 AM on your designated pick-up day.

*October 2019 Employee of the Month - Greg Orloski*



Greg Orloski from the Cedar City Fire Department is the EAC's Employee of the Month for October 2019. He was nominated by his supervisor, Lowell Sorensen, and Lowell had this to say about him:

"Over the past 2 months, Greg has led the Fire Department project of refinishing the fire station engine bay floors. This project entailed a lot of planning, so apparatus and equipment could be moved while sections were prepped, washed, painted with epoxy and rethane coats, then allowed to cure for 2 weeks before returning apparatus. All the while allowing for normal fire department operations to take place. The bay floors were also striped with yellow markings to reduce the trip hazard per OSHA requirements and with black parking guidance lines. Greg's meticulous attention to detail ensured that the lines are sharp, crisp and to perfection. This project has left the fire station bays looking very professional and the envy of any professional painter. Greg's great work ethic and an eye for detail saved the department tens of thousands of dollars in hiring a professional painter to do the job."

During the week of October 12th – 17th, Cedar City will be celebrating the 150th anniversary of the Transcontinental Railroad and the driving of the Golden Spike. There will be plenty for everyone with all the events that are happening and they're all **FREE**.

Beginning October 12th at 6:30 p.m., the Cedar City Visitor Center will be showing the 1939 Cecil B. DeMille classic movie, *Union Pacific*, which was filmed right here in Iron County! For more information on this event, call the Visitor's Center at (435)586-5124.

On October 12th from 12-6 p.m., SUMA will be hosting a traveling exhibition called *A World Transformed: The Transcontinental Railroad and Utah*, which tells the story of Utah's contribution to the completion of the transcontinental railroad and the effects on Utah. There will be a railroad display, live music and activities. On October 15th at 4:00 p.m., SUMA will be hosting a walking tour with Ryan Paul, an SUU history lecturer, where you'll learn more about the imagery and artifacts found during the exhibition. On Wednesday, October 16th from 2-4 p.m., SUMA invites kids to get involved at Wonder Wednesday, where there will be railroad themed activities for school children K-5.
